The significance of the journey and the work each day is never ever to turn anyone way.


The atmosphere of kindness ,love, and encouragement and hope to walk in the steps of God above.

Nebo RZUA Church. For thirty-nine years, Reverend Boyd was employed with the Norfolk Naval Shipyard where he was Quality Assurance Supervisor when he retired on December 31, 2011. Reverend Boyd earned his Doctor of Ministry Degree from Norfolk Theological Seminary and College in June 2007, in addition to his Bachelor and Master's degrees, respectively. Did you know that?


